Background

- Peninsula Community Service District (former known as Samoa Peninsula Fire Protection District)
 - Fairhaven Fire Protection District contracted with CalPERS effective July 6, 1970.
 - In 1993, Fairhaven Fire Protection District merged with the Samoa Volunteer Fire Department and changed name to Samoa Peninsula Fire Protection District (SPFPD).
 - In 2001, SPFPD became a volunteer fire district.
 - In 2017, SPFPD began the reorganization process to become Peninsula Community Service District (PCSD).
 - In April 2020, PCSD became a successor agency of SPFPD.
 - January 2020, SPFPD owed \$39K in delinquent unfunded liability payments.
 - March 2020, CalPERS agreed on a payment arrangement and was scheduled to end by July 1, 2021
 - May 2021, CalPERS agreed to extend the payment arrangement for one year.
 - Since November 2022, PCSD has not made any payments toward their pension obligations.
 - As of January 23, 2023, PCSD owed CalPERS \$363,789, which includes \$48,558 interest.



Collection Efforts

- Made monthly collection phone calls and engaged in multiple conference calls to discuss the outstanding debts with the district.
- Sent Final collection and demand letters.
- Request financial assistance from Humboldt County 4th District Supervisor.
- Notified impacted members, Humboldt County Supervisor and stakeholders.
