Issues/Status:	<p>This is a CCP Section 1085 writ seeking to compel CalPERS to provide “predictable and legally understandable retirement benefits to the employees of CPS.” It further seeks to compel CalPERS to set and collect contributions which are actuarially related to the retirement benefits that will be ultimately provided to CPS’ intermittent consultants who have been found to be “employees” of CPS for purposes of CalPERS benefits.</p> <p>CPS alleges that it has been damaged and continues to be damaged by CalPERS because it cannot attract qualified people to be intermittent consultants when their future pension benefits are so “capricious and unpredictable.”</p>
