

Legislative History

2012 AB 2142 (Furutani, Chapter 445, Statutes of 2012) - Authorized CalPERS to implement risk adjustment procedures that adjust and redistribute payments across its health plans based on rules and regulations established by the CalPERS Board of Administration (Board). It also allowed the Board to adjust premiums as part of health promotion and disease management programs, and made changes to the Health Care Fund (HCF) that are necessary to manage the risk adjustment program.

AB 1636 (Monning, 2012) - Would have required the Department of Managed Health Care, in collaboration with the Department of Insurance, the California Health Benefit Exchange, and the State Department of Public Health, to convene a special committee to review and evaluate health and wellness incentive and rewards programs offered by healthcare service plans, health insurers, and employers. The bill also would have required the committee to evaluate these programs for effectiveness based upon scientific evidence and to examine the extent to which these programs may result in specified discrimination. AB 1636 was held in the Senate Appropriations Committee. *CalPERS Position: None*

2003 SB 436 (Soto, Chapter 751, Statutes of 2003) - Improved CalPERS health plan flexibility and sustainability by allowing the CalPERS Board to establish criteria by regulation for agencies electing to participate in the program, enter into longer-term contracts with health plans, offer health plans with regionally priced premiums for employees and annuitants of contracting agencies, and offer health plans exclusively for the employees and annuitants of contracting agencies.
