







This shall serve as a Petition for Reconsideration to the Board of Administration of the California Public Employees' Retirement System. I disagree and ask for reconsideration based on the following:

- 1 No application for reinstatement has ever been filed by me, even though all the paperwork implies that I did.
- 2 The CalPERS doctor did not perform all the necessary aspects of the evaluation, namely, he did not go over the 14 Critical Tasks. There were two requests sent by Joe Klockgether of CalPERS requesting further information regarding the 14 Critical tasks list in which he must address each and every task as required by CalPERS and the California Highway Patrol. The first was on January 10, 2012 and the second on March 2, 2012. It took the doctor 24 days to file his second report, which is a violation of his IME Eligibility Agreement (he has 7 days to file his report) and in his supplemental reports only refers back to his original report which addresses the "State Personnel Board Requirements, not the 14 Critical Tasks. The doctor also admitted he had never seen the 14 Critical Tasks list before the morning of the hearing on December 19, 2013.
