Retirement Security - What's new in Washington?

- GAO reports on retirement savings
 - Half of older households (55 and over) have no retirement savings
- DOL Fiduciary Rule
 - Consumer protection or threat to retirement planning?
- Lifetime Income Disclosure requirements
 - DOL proposed rule expected this summer
 - Bipartisan legislation in House and Senate
- "Building Better Savings, Building Brighter Futures" (Congressman Joe Crowley, Vice Chair, Democratic Caucus)

- 26 Senators questioned the President on the state of retirement savings in America.
 - Called on Treasury and DOL to remove barriers to state-based retirement savings initiatives.
- Senator Hatch... 'top priority for savings and investment is to make it easier for small employers to provide retirement plans for workers.'
- Study links shift from DB to DC plans to increase in income inequality.

Threats to public employee retirement benefits.

- Secure Annuities for Employees (SAFE) Retirement Act (Senator Hatch, S. 1270 – 113th Congress)
- Public Employee Pension Transparency Act (Congressmen Nunes, Ryan, and Issa, H.R. 1628 – 113th Congress)

- H.R. 2146, Defending Public Safety Employees' Retirement Act
- H.R. 606, Don't Tax Our Fallen Public Safety Heroes Act
- H.R. 711, Equal Treatment of Public Servants Act of 2015
