Ground Rules

Consultant Findings

- In July and August 2015, all 13 CalPERS Board members were interviewed about their views of how to improve governance at CalPERS.
- Executive Team members also provided feedback. Questions:
- 1. From a governance perspective, what's working well, what needs to be improved?
- 2. What specific "products" would you like to focus on?



Consultant Findings

Key themes:

- 1. Discuss how the Board acts as a collective body in directing the organization.
- 2. Review our travel policy.
- 3. Define the job of the Board and the jobs of Board members.
- 4. Review the role and duties of the Board president and committee chairs.
- 5. Clarify acceptable Board member behavior and our enforcement process.
- 6. Evaluate the frequency and duration of our meetings.
- 7. Evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of having committees of the whole.
- 8. Review all of the Board's governance policies and update them as needed.



Consultant Findings

Other topics mentioned:

- Review the process for deciding how Board members represent CalPERS on outside boards.
- Review and discuss the process of new Board member orientation.



Consultant Findings Proposed Work Plan

- 1. Tackle each of these issues in succession (see handout).
- 2. Dive into one new issue each meeting, while also carrying forward the work from prior meetings.
- 3. Facilitate agreement on specific policies.
- 4. Forward agreed-upon policies to the Board to approve as a block.
