Deputy City Attorney David B. Brearley appeared before the Committee to answer any questions relative to any item or items that may be discussed by the Committee.

Communication from A. E. Nelson, Jr., Director of Public Works/Building, dated April 12, 1977, transmitting certain material in connection with the Communications Consulting Contract between Fieler & Associates and the City; and making certain enumerated requests, was presented. for a Deputy City Clerk, Purchasing Agent and a Deputy City Clerk-Payroll as soon as possible;

(3) That Bruce V. Malkenhorst be appointed to the position of City Clerk-Director of Finance, Step 5, effective July 1, 1977; and

(4) That Sheila H. McKenna be promoted to Deputy City Treasurer-Deputy City Clerk-Accountant, Grade 3, effective July 1, 1977, as she is presently investing the City's surplus funds.

Motion carried.

Discussion was held with reference to the group insurance premiums for miscellaneous employees and their dependents.

It was moved by Gonzales, seconded by Ybarra, that effective July 1, 1977, the City pay the group insurance premiums for miscellaneous employees and their dependents equal to the premium charged for such coverage as of June 30, 1977. (This amounts to a nine-percent increase over the existing premium paid as of June 30, 1976)

In the Memorandum of Understanding with the Vernon Police Officers' Benefit Association, the City is required to pay for police officers and their dependents any increase in premium up to ten percent (10%) of the premium in effect as of June 30, 1976, effective July 1, 1977. This means that the City will be required to pay the total premium for Police Officers, effective as of July 1, 1977, as the increase is only nine percent (9%).

Discussion was held with reference to Fire Department personnel driving City-owned automobiles home and with reference to personnel receiving automobile allowances.

It was moved by Gonzales, seconded by Ybarra, that the Finance Committee make the following recommendations to the City Council:

(1) That the personnel of the Fire Department be prohibited from driving any City vehicles home, effective July 1, 1977;

(2) That effective July 1, 1977, the automobile allowance for the Fire Chief be eliminated and that he be furnished a City-owned vehicle to be used only for official business;

(3) That effective July 1, 1977, personnel using their private vehicles in the service of the City, with the exception of the Building Inspectors, the Senior Building Inspectors, the Construction Inspector and the person in charge of the Industrial Waste Program, shall be required to have a passenger vehicle, compact or larger, capable of carrying a minimum of four passengers, and that personnel using vans, pickups and recreational vehicles will not be eligible for auto allowances; and

(4) That the Finance Committee have the sole discretion in determining the definition of a compact automobile, and that the Finance Committee be authorized to allow other exemptions if it deems that a compact automobile is not necessary for a job classification.

Motion carried.

At this time, 11:35 o'clock a.m., Committee Member Gonzales was excused.

The City Clerk-Director of Finance discussed with members of the Committee the departmental requests for consideration in the 1977-78 budget appropriation.

No action taken.

It was moved by Ybarra, seconded by Malburg, that the meeting adjourn until Wednesday, May 11, 1977, at 9:00 o'clock a.m. in the Lunch Room of the Public Works Facility at 4305 Santa Fe Avenue, Vernon, California. Motion carried.
