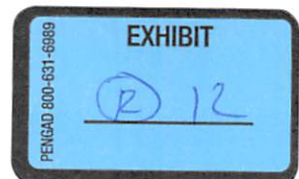
Dear Mr. Lewis:

In connection with your application for industrial disability retirement your employer has found you to be incapacitated for the performance of your duties as a Fire Captain. Your incapacity is industrial.

Subject to regular requirements of law, your date of retirement, the day following the date your employer gives as your last day on payroll, will be November 1, 2012. You will receive further information regarding your allowance under separate cover.

Your retirement status and benefits will be adjusted from service to industrial disability retroactive to your effective retirement date. You will receive a Roll Change Adjustment Letter prior to receiving your first disability retirement warrant. You should receive your first disability retirement warrant within 120 days of your approval date. If you wish to continue service retirement instead of changing to industrial disability, you must submit your written request within 30 days of the date of this letter. To determine which retirement may be more advantageous to you, please refer to your retirement estimates and Disability Retirement booklet.

If you consider employment in the future, you may be required to report all earned income on a monthly basis. If the earnings from future employment exceed the maximum compensation currently earnable in the position held at the time of industrial disability retirement, that pension portion of your retirement allowance will be reduced (Government Code section 21228). You must contact CalPERS for approval prior to accepting employment which is permanent or exceeds 960 hours per year. Failure to get prior approval could result in reinstatement to that position, termination of your retirement allowance, and possible administrative penalties.
