RESPONDENT'S REQUEST FOR 11 PROTECTIVE ORDER SEALING CONFIDENTIAL RECORDS and 12 CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL, Hearing Date: September 15, 2016 Hearing Location: Fresno 13 Respondent. ALJ Coren Wong, presiding 14 15 Petitioner California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) submits 16 the following Opposition to Respondent's Request for Protective Order Sealing 17 Confidential Records in its official capacity, and not otherwise. 18 Hearing in this matter was completed on September 15, 2016 in Fresno, CA. 19 The record remained open for the parties to submit Closing Briefs on October 17, 20 2016. Both Respondent and CalPERS submitted timely Closing Briefs. 21 Also on October 17, 2016, Respondent served a Request for Protective Order 22 Sealing Confidential Records. Respondent wants confidential information including 23 medical information, names of minor(s), and Respondent's personal information to be 24 sealed. His solution is to seal entire documents. CalPERS objects. 25

As a preliminary matter, CalPERS properly redacted all confidential information from its exhibits. The only documents which were not redacted were Respondent's exhibits.

As ALJ Wong attempted to explain to Respondent numerous times during hearing, there is no issue regarding Respondent's medical condition here. The *only issue* here is whether his termination and Stipulated Settlement preclude his ability to file for Industrial Disability Retirement (IDR) under *Haywood*, *Smith and Vandergoot*. All the medical documents Respondent submitted are irrelevant to that single issue.

Only if Respondent's appeal survives the *Haywood* hearing, will the issue of his medical condition become relevant. Therefore, Respondent should properly withdraw all his medical records from consideration.

Despite numerous explanations at hearing, Respondent nevertheless decided to submit various medical records at hearing. They were all admitted as administrative hearsay. CalPERS has no objection to confidential information being redacted from Respondent's documents. In fact, he should have redacted them before he submitted his exhibits. Respondent's address, home phone number and social security number should have been redacted prior to these documents being submitted at hearing. If Respondent's documents also contain names of minor(s), CalPERS does not object to the minor(s)' names being redacted as well.

However, there is simply no basis for Respondent's documents to be sealed in their entirety. Respondent gives no reason for sealing the records. If Respondent wants his medical information to be private, he should not have submitted irrelevant medical documents at a *Haywood* hearing in the first place. Or he could have withdrawn those irrelevant medical records when the process and purpose of a *Haywood* proceeding was explained to him over and over during the hearing. But he

did not. CalPERS renews its objection that all these medical records are simply irrelevant to a *Haywood* hearing.

As to any of Respondent's exhibits, CalPERS does not object to confidential information such as address, phone number, social security number and names of minor(s) being redacted. The documents themselves do not need to be sealed if the confidential information is redacted.

Respondent's request to seal these records is untimely. The record remained open for 30 days for one purpose only: to file/serve Closing Briefs. Respondent attempts an end run by requesting documents to be sealed well after the hearing has concluded. This Court should not engage in Respondent's games at this late date.

For all the foregoing reasons, CalPERS renews its objection that Respondent's medical records should not have been admitted, not even as administrative hearsay. They are irrelevant to the single issue being decided. CalPERS agrees that certain confidential information (address, phone number, SSN and minor(s) names) may be redacted from Respondent's exhibits. If properly redacted, sealing is unnecessary. Therefore, CalPERS objects to Respondent's Request for Protective Order Sealing Confidential Records in their entirety.
