

High and Low Value Care Across the Consumer, Provider and Purchaser

Bio **Former Executive Director of the Center for Healthcare Decisions**

Until her retirement last summer, Marge was the Executive Director of the Center for Healthcare Decisions (CHCD), a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization dedicated to promoting/ conducting civic engagement related to complex health policy issues. She founded CHCD in 1994, recognizing that the general public needed a greater role in addressing challenging issues faced by healthcare policymakers, purchasers and providers. Funded by grants and contracts, CHCD has gathered the citizen perspective on such topics as end-of-life care; cost-effectiveness in clinical and coverage decisions; design of health plan benefits; priorities for quality improvement; the use of evidence in clinical decisions; and ways to reduce low-value care.

While at CHCD, Marge served on the boards of National Quality Forum and the Integrated Healthcare Association, as well as NCQA's Committee on Performance Measurement, among others. In 2011, she was a committee member for Determining the Essential Health Care Benefits under the Institute of Medicine, established by the newly-formed ACA.

Prior to her work with CHCD, Marge was Director, Aging Health Services at the Institute on Aging, San Francisco; established CA's first public sector Adult Day Health Center at Laguna Honda Hospital; was a home care nurse with the SF VNA; a Peace Corps nurse in Nepal; and a volunteer nurse for the United Farm Workers. She received her nursing degree from the University of Maryland and an MPH from UC Berkeley.
