<b>Issues/Status:</b>	Lawsuit alleges breach of contract and breach of implied covenant of good faith and fair dealing. The alleged breach arises from CalPERS' decision to reduce the plaintiffs' retirement formulas after they moved from the employ of a local agency to the California Department of Justice. Plaintiffs seek specific performance of contract; compensatory damages according to proof; costs incurred; prejudgment interest; and such other relief as the court deems just and proper.
