

Legislative History

- 2012 Chapter 296 (AB 340, Furutani) – Established the California Public Employees’ Pension Reform Act of 2013 (PEPRA). Among other things, defined “pensionable compensation” as a new member’s (hired on or after January 1, 2013) normal monthly rate of pay or base pay paid in cash to similarly situation members of the same employment group or class for services rendered on a full-time basis during normal working hours, pursuant to a publicly available pay schedule.
- 1993 Chapter 1297 (SB 53, Russell) – Made significant changes to retirement law to curb payroll reporting abuses. Among other things, provided a clear definition of compensation and required the Board of Administration to develop regulations to clarify what constitutes “special compensation.” *CalPERS Position: Sponsor*
- 1988 Chapter 1089 (SB 2648, Kopp) – Revised statutes pertaining to the correction of errors and omissions. Among other things, clarified that “negligence” is not ground for correction, established that errors and omissions by members or beneficiaries are permissively correctable, while mistakes by the System or employing agencies are mandatorily correctable, and imposed upon the party seeking correction the burden of providing the Board with evidence of entitlement to the correction within six months of discovery. *CalPERS Position: Co-Sponsor*
- 1953 Chapter 764 (AB 487, Fleury) – Established Article 3.5 of the State Employees’ Retirement Law relating to the correction of errors and omissions.
- 1945 Chapter 123 (SB 1150, Fletcher) – Established the State Employees’ Retirement Law. Among other things, required CalPERS to adjust contributions of the member, state, or contracting agency if the amount required is more or less than the correct amount and correct any other errors in payments made to or by the board.
