#### **Economic Impact of Mental Illness**



\$210.5 billion

in lost earnings per year in the U.S. due to mental illness<sup>1</sup>



In the U.S., depression ranks
among the top 3
workplace issues¹ and is the
leading cause
of disability
among people ages 15-44¹



Treating any mental illness leads to an estimated return of

\$4 for every \$1 spent

due to the increase in the ability to work<sup>2</sup>

## Moving Toward Parity in California

#### 1996

Congress passed 1st federal parity law, the Mental Health Parity Act

#### 1999

California passed the California Mental Health Parity Act (CMHPA)

#### 2008

Congress passed the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act (MHPAEA)

#### <u>2010</u>

Affordable Care Act extended MHPAEA to more health plans



## Problems Emerge Early



Majority of serious mental illnesses first appear before age 25




1 out of 6 adults

Over the last 10 years hospitalizations for mental health emergencies spiked 40% among young people




## Suicide Rates are Climbing in California

#### Top Three Conditions by Prevalence (Basic)

1. Depression 4.7%

2. Anxiety Disorder 3.5%

3. Neuroses 2.0%

### Top Three Conditions by Cost (Basic)

1. Depression \$102,490,000

2. Anxiety Disorder \$36,000,000

3. Neuroses \$29,250,000
