Issues/Status:

The Beverly Hills Police Officers' Association (Association), the organization that represents police officers and police sergeants for the City of Beverly Hills (City), sued the City due to an alleged breach of contract. The Association alleges that the City failed to provide the negotiated benefits (3% at 50) for all of the police personnel hired prior to July 1, 2012. The Association alleges the City failed to properly amend its contract with CalPERS to ensure the negotiated benefits were properly paid. The Second Amended Complaint does not allege CalPERS breached any duty, to the Association or the City, but alleges that complete relief is unavailable unless CalPERS is named as a party. CalPERS is in the process of filing an Answer to the Complaint.
