Today's action item for the Committee is the finalist selection of the independent financial statement auditor presented by our Chief Actuary -- Auditor, Beliz Chappuie. Our current auditor's contract will expire with the conclusion of the fiscal year 2015-16 financial statement audit, which is currently underway.

On May 11th of this year, CalPERS released a request for proposal for the independent financial statement auditor and received 4 proposals. Three of the 4 proposals passed the technical and fee proposal evaluations.

Today you will be asked to select finalists from those proposals. Those finalists will then appear in front of the Committee in November for an oral interview.

Item 6a is a risk profile review that outlines the summary of the top 10 risks being presented to each of the Board Committees, each with a profile of the specific risk assigned to the respective committee. The compliance risk profile is being provided to the Risk and Audit Committee for review as this represents your direct oversight for compliance risk.

The next Risk and Audit Committee meeting is scheduled for November 15th, 2016, and includes the semi-annual enterprise risk reports, including the updated

risk dashboard, the third-party valuation and certification of the contracting public agency plans as of June 30th, 2014, which provides independent assurance of the valuation reports completed by the Actuarial Office; the review of the independent auditor's financial letter; the annual review of the independent auditor's report for the financial statements ending June 30th, 2016; and as mentioned earlier, the finalist interviews for the independent financial statement auditor.

And this concludes my report, Mr. Chair. And I would be happy to take any questions.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: We have one from Mr. Jelincic.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: The calendar for the year shows that we get the independent auditor's report in November, but the draft agenda doesn't show that, unless I'm missing something?

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER EASON: Oh. All right.

It should. We will correct that.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: Okay. And that explains why you didn't tell us about it.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: All right. We're on to action consent. Can I have a motion to approve the minutes of June 13th.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: Oh, I had made the point earlier, that the annual calendar in the draft agenda didn't lineup, but they're going to fix that.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Oh, okay. You made that point before I got to that item, in other words.

So we are on to Action Agenda Items, number 5, the Audit. Beliz Chappuie, please.

CHIEF AUDITOR CHAPPUIE: Good afternoon, Mr.
Chair, members of the Committee. Beliz Chappuie, CalPERS staff.

Agenda Item 5a is an action item related to selection of finalists for the independent financial statement auditor. Staff recommend the firms who have passed the technical proposal evaluation to the Board for selection of finalists to appear before the Risk and Audit Committee in November 2016 for an oral interview.

On November 17, 2015, the Board approved the release of a Request for Proposal to initiate a competitive selection process to engage the services of a qualified audit firm to perform audits of CalPERS financial statements for fiscal years 2016-17 through 2021.

On May 11, 2016, CalPERS released RFP and received 4 proposals. A team of CalPERS staff performed the technical proposal evaluations. Two Risk and Audit Committee members were advisors during this process. Three of the 4 firms passed the preliminary review and the technical proposal evaluation. Then the fee proposal evaluations were performed and the firms were ranked based on the fee scores they received.

The applicable incentive points were also included in the rankings for consideration during the interviews.

To summarize, Macias, Gini & O'Connell received 300 points, Crow Horwath received 140 points, and Grant Thornton received 122 points.

Finally, staff performed background and reference checks and all finalists rated as satisfactory. The firms that passed the technical proposal evaluation and selected as finalists by the Board are eligible to move on to the interview phase.

The next step in the RFP process, the selected finalists will be invited to appear before the Risk and Audit Committee in November. Each firm will have 30 minutes before the Risk and Audit Committee, which will consist of a 10-minute presentation and a 20-minute question and answer session.

The interviews will be evaluated using a consensus scoring methodology. The Risk and Audit Committee will determine a score as a group for each finalist and motion the interview score with a maximum of 700 points. Each proposer's interview score will be combined with a preliminary score for its total score. Proposals will be ranked according to their total score from highest to lowest.

This concludes my presentation. I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Thank you.

So our task today is to determine how many, and which we send to the next process in November, whether it's 2 or 3, and if it's 2, which 2, correct?

CHIEF AUDITOR CHAPPUIE: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Mr. Jelincic.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: I will move that we interview all 3 of them. While there's a great range in the preliminary scores, the technical scores, although

they didn't carry forward, but really measured the ability of the firms to do it, were actually very competitive, and very close. So I would encourage us to interview all 3.

COMMITTEE MEMBER MATHUR: Second.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Okay. We've got a motion by Jelincic, the second by Mathur to interview all 3.

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER EASON: And Chief Risk Officer, Forrest Grimes, will be joining me.

The agenda Item 6a is being presented today really for two purposes. First, we wanted to bring to the attention of the Committee the 10 risk statements assigned to each Board committee with their oversight for risk.

25 | And secondly, the Committee's -- this Committee's

compliance risk profile. It outlines the risk statement, risk drivers, associated mitigations and controls currently in place, as well as any future mitigations planned to continue to enhance and strengthen the risk mitigation activities around this risk statement.

And I would just ask if Forrest has -- Grimes, Chief Risk Officer for CalPERS to comment on any specific compliance risk profile. And, as well, just outline the process for our risk reviews leading to our November risk reports and the risk dashboard that you will receive as a committee in November.

CHIEF RISK OFFICER GRIMES: Thank you, Cheryl.

Forrest Grimes, CalPERS staff. What I would like to do is to engage you in any conversation or comments or questions that you may have regarding the risk framework in general that you've heard about in other Committee meetings this week, as well as the Compliance Risk Profile specifically which this committee does have delegated authority to approve and oversee.

So with that, Mr. Chair, I would seek comments and questions.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Mr. Jelincic.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: On the future mitigations, Risk 2, unethical behavior by staff and executive. I noticed we have no planned mitigations

there. Is that a statement that we've got a complete handle on it and -- or what does it really suggest?

CHIEF RISK OFFICER GRIMES: Yes, Mr. Jelincic, I think that is a good question. And just so you understand the intent of that, future mitigations, we have actually really concluded that those should be limited to those things that would appear on a business plan. So these are just not nice-to-haves. These would be planned for.

And so I think your comment is exactly accurate, and I would propose that we would omit that number 2 item, when we bring it back to you in November.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: But on the current -page earlier, we have a number of things under that same
risk. So obviously, there are some mitigations and
controls.

CHIEF RISK OFFICER GRIMES: Yes, and I -- do you mind if I --

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: No. I'm trying to elicit a --

CHIEF RISK OFFICER GRIMES: Sure. Truly, I think that was an oversight by staff. And really, we kind of tried to answer, in this particular profile sheet, have a response for each particular driver that appeared on the prior page. The other risk profiles that you viewed earlier in the week did not really have a response for

every particular risk driver. So this was, I believe, just an oversight. But I do think that it kind of gives a good segue into a conversation on what I would like to do ultimately, and what staff would like to do ultimately, which we hope to kick-off in January, which would be to discuss risk appetite and tolerances with the Board.

And, in essence, that would perhaps -- the way that this was really intended to be used is, if you, the Board, thought that we were not mitigating a risk appropriately, that would give you an opportunity to suggest some future mitigations. So that's really a tool that we're intending to use moving forward to further advance controlling risk within the organization.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: All right. I don't see anyone else wishing to speak, so we'll hear more about this at our November meeting. Thank you for your work on it.

CHIEF RISK OFFICER GRIMES: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: And that brings us to summary of Committee direction. Cheryl, I don't have any, do you?

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER EASON: No, I don't.
CHAIRPERSON LIND: Okay. We're easy today.

COMMITTEE MEMBER JELINCIC: They have to fix the

agenda.

CHAIRPERSON LIND: Oh, yeah, fix the agenda.

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER EASON: Yes. Thank you. CHAIRPERSON LIND: All right. I don't show anyone wishing -- from the public wishing to speak. So this meeting is adjourned.
