The information provided below relates to the population with both chronic and acute kidney conditions including End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD).

When are members with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) signing up for Medicare? Do Medicare eligible ESRD use COBRA to retain commercial insurance after leaving employment?

CalPERS does not collect the data on when members with kidney failure sign up for Medicare. In 2016 almost 60 percent of members receiving dialysis treatment were enrolled in Medicare plans.

The intentions of Medicare eligible ESRD patients using COBRA are not known to CalPERS. Only 0.6 percent of the members receiving dialysis treatment have COBRA coverage in 2016.

Has plan compared rates to the market recently?

CalPERS cost¹ per dialysis procedure for both basic (\$520² vs. \$927), and Medicare (\$214 vs. \$225) plans were lower than benchmark³.

What types of dialysis are CalPERS members utilizing (peritoneal or hemodialysis)?

Hemodialysis accounts for almost 70 percent of dialysis treatments in Basic plans, and more than 90 percent in Medicare plans.

Are members starting dialysis too soon?

Treatment of dialysis is determined by medical professionals as deemed necessary.

Do patients of all races have equal access to transplant?

Race information is not captured in the Health Care Decision Support System (HCDSS).

What is the population's transplant rate?

In 2016, 50 of 1,552 members receiving dialysis treatment had kidney transplant (3.2 percent).
