CalPERS Board of Administration requires contract participation from certified Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) in its contract process, unless specifically exempted. A sole proprietorship at least 51 percent owned by one or more disabled veterans; or in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of its stock is owned by one or more disabled veterans; a subsidiary which is wholly owned by a parent corporation, but only if at least 51 percent of the voting stock of the parent corporation is owned by one or more disabled veterans; or a joint venture in which at least 51 percent of the joint venture's management and control and earnings are held by one or more disabled veterans.
 - 2. The management and control of the daily business operations are by one or more disabled veterans. The disabled veterans who exercise management and control are not required to be the same disabled veterans as the owners of the business concern.
 - 3. It is a sole proprietorship, corporation, or partnership with its home office located in the United States, which is not a branch or subsidiary of a foreign corporation, foreign firm, or other foreign based business.

- **C. Commercially Useful Function** A DVBE contractor, subcontractors, or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets all of the following criteria:
 - 1. The business concern is:
 - (a) Responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract;
 - (b) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved;
 - (c) Performs work that is normal for its business, services and function; and
 - 2. The business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work that is greater than would be expected by normal industry practices.

A contractor, subcontractor, or supplier will not be considered to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor's, subcontractor's, or supplier's role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of small business, microbusiness, or DVBE participation. When subcontracting to small, micro, or DVBE subcontractors, the intent is for the subcontractor to provide goods or services required for the performance of the contract rather than artificial or incidental participation that provides an "appearance" of participation to meet the socio-economic objectives of these programs.

USE/SUBSTITUTION OF PROPOSED DVBE

Meeting the Goal

- 1. Proposing incentive goal attainment is a <u>commitment</u> to use disabled veteran business enterprises for the established percent of the contract amount. If awarded a contract, CalPERS expects the DVBE subcontractors or suppliers to be utilized as identified in your proposal, unless a substitution is approved by CalPERS.
- 2. An expression of <u>intent</u> to subcontract with unidentified DVBE firms at some future date <u>is insufficient</u> to comply with DVBE incentive participation. Commitments must be finalized upon submission of your contract participation documentation to CalPERS.
- 3. **Out-of-state firms** are not excluded from participating in the DVBE incentive program. To do business with CalPERS, completion of this document is required for all bidders.

DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CONTRACT PARTICIPATION

CalPERS Board of Administration requires contract participation from certified Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) in its contract process, unless specifically exempted. Only State of California, Office of Small Business and DVBE Services (OSDS) may certify a DVBE. The DVBE must perform a commercially useful function relevant to this solicitation to be considered compliant with the DVBE program requirements. In order to obtain DVBE incentive participation credit, the contractor must be a certified DVBE or subcontract with a DVBE, certified by OSDS, no later than the Final Filing Date as specified in the Schedule of Events.

Please read the following requirements carefully. Completion of this document is required regardless of intent to pursue DVBE incentive participation.

I. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

For the purpose of this DVBE incentive participation, the following definitions apply:

- A. **Disabled veteran** means a veteran of the military, naval, or air services of the United States with a **service-connected disability of ten percent or more**, who is a resident of the State of California.
- **B. DVBE** means a business concern certified by OSDS as meeting all of the following:
 - 1. A sole proprietorship at least 51 percent owned by one or more disabled veterans; or in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of its stock is owned by one or more disabled veterans; a subsidiary which is wholly owned by a parent corporation, but only if at least 51 percent of the voting stock of the parent corporation is owned by one or more disabled veterans; or a joint venture in which at least 51 percent of the joint venture's management and control and earnings are held by one or more disabled veterans.
 - 2. The management and control of the daily business operations are by one or more disabled veterans. The disabled veterans who exercise management and control are not required to be the same disabled veterans as the owners of the business concern.
 - 3. It is a sole proprietorship, corporation, or partnership with its home office located in the United States, which is not a branch or subsidiary of a foreign corporation, foreign firm, or other foreign based business.

- Commercially Useful Function A DVBE contractor, subcontractors, or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets all of the following criteria:
 - 1. The business concern is:
 - (a) Responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract;
 - (b) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved;
 - (c) Performs work that is normal for its business, services and function; and
 - 2. The business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work that is greater than would be expected by normal industry practices.

A contractor, subcontractor, or supplier will not be considered to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor's, subcontractor's, or supplier's role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of small business, microbusiness, or DVBE participation. When subcontracting to small, micro, or DVBE subcontractors, the intent is for the subcontractor to provide goods or services required for the performance of the contract rather than artificial or incidental participation that provides an "appearance" of participation to meet the socio-economic objectives of these programs.

II. DVBE PARTICIPATION OPTIONS AND DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be **responsive** to the incentive participation, bidders will complete and submit Attachment G, Exhibit 1, DVBE Contract Participation and select one of the following options:

- A. Option A DVBE Incentive. A bidder may submit DVBE participation percentages to receive and qualify for the incentive program. Bids that fail to submit the required form and confirm the level of DVBE participation will not be eligible to receive the DVBE incentive. - D. A revised DVBE Contract Participation (Attachment G, Exhibit 1) and applicable certification(s).

The request and CalPERS approval or disapproval of the substitution shall not affect compliance with any other provision of law, or any other contract requirements relating to substitution of subcontractors.

Meeting the Goal

- 1. Proposing incentive goal attainment is a <u>commitment</u> to use disabled veteran business enterprises for the established percent of the contract amount. If awarded a contract, CalPERS expects the DVBE subcontractors or suppliers to be utilized as identified in your proposal, unless a substitution is approved by CalPERS.
- 2. An expression of <u>intent</u> to subcontract with unidentified DVBE firms at some future date <u>is insufficient</u> to comply with DVBE incentive participation. Commitments must be finalized upon submission of your contract participation documentation to CalPERS.
- 3. **Out-of-state firms** are not excluded from participating in the DVBE incentive program. To do business with CalPERS, completion of this document is required for all bidders.

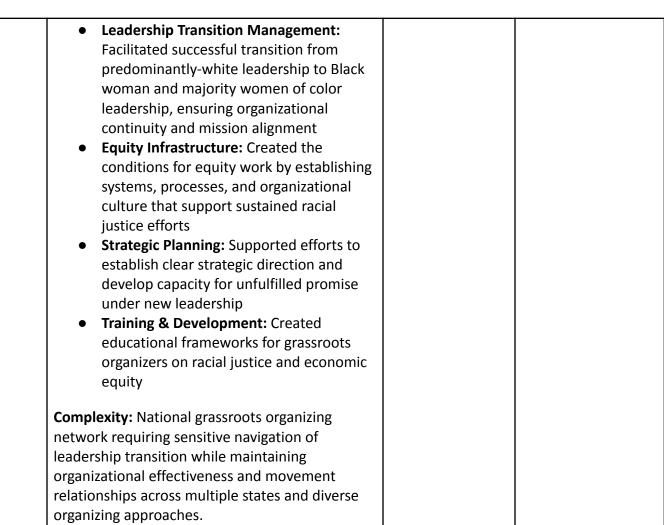

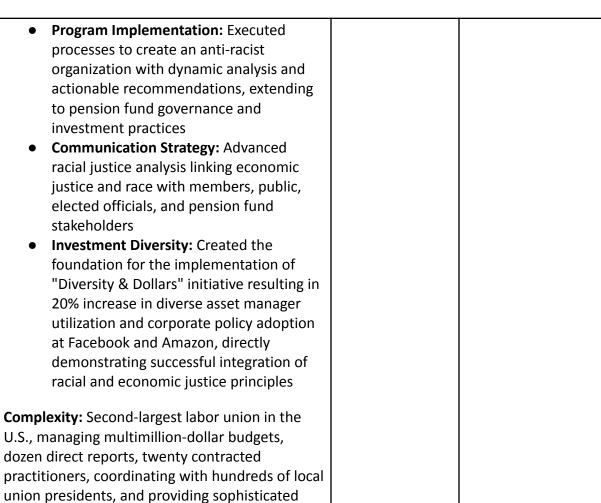

DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CONTRACT PARTICIPATION

CalPERS Board of Administration requires contract participation from certified Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) in its contract process, unless specifically exempted. Only State of California, Office of Small Business and DVBE Services (OSDS) may certify a DVBE. The DVBE must perform a commercially useful function relevant to this solicitation to be considered compliant with the DVBE program requirements. In order to obtain DVBE incentive participation credit, the contractor must be a certified DVBE or subcontract with a DVBE, certified by OSDS, no later than the Final Filing Date as specified in the Schedule of Events.

Please read the following requirements carefully. Completion of this document is required regardless of intent to pursue DVBE incentive participation.

I. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

For the purpose of this DVBE incentive participation, the following definitions apply:

- A. Disabled veteran means a veteran of the military, naval, or air services of the United States with a service-connected disability of ten percent or more, who is a resident of the State of California.
- B. **DVBE** means a business concern <u>certified by OSDS</u> as meeting all of the following:
 - 1. A sole proprietorship at least 51 percent owned by one or more disabled veterans; or in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of its stock is owned by one or more disabled veterans; a subsidiary which is wholly owned by a parent corporation, but only if at least 51 percent of the voting stock of the parent corporation is owned by one or more disabled veterans; or a joint venture in which at least 51 percent of the joint venture's management and control and earnings are held by one or more disabled veterans.
 - 2. The management and control of the daily business operations are by one or more disabled veterans. The disabled veterans who exercise management and control are not required to be the same disabled veterans as the owners of the business concern.
 - 3. It is a sole proprietorship, corporation, or partnership with its home office located in the United States, which is not a branch or subsidiary of a foreign corporation, foreign firm, or other foreign based business.

- C. Commercially Useful Function A DVBE contractor, subcontractors, or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets all of the following criteria:
 - 1. The business concern is:
 - (a) Responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract;
 - (b) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved;
 - (c) Performs work that is normal for its business, services and function; and
 - The business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work that is greater than would be expected by normal industry practices.

A contractor, subcontractor, or supplier will not be considered to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor's, subcontractor's, or supplier's role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of small business, microbusiness, or DVBE participation. When subcontracting to small, micro, or DVBE subcontractors, the intent is for the subcontractor to provide goods or services required for the performance of the contract rather than artificial or incidental participation that provides an "appearance" of participation to meet the socio-economic objectives of these programs.

II. DVBE PARTICIPATION OPTIONS AND DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be **responsive** to the incentive participation, bidders will complete and submit Attachment G, Exhibit 1, DVBE Contract Participation and select one of the following options:

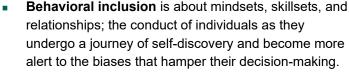

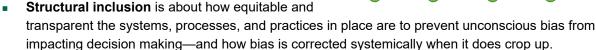

We then synthesize all insights into a findings report.





The final findings report leverages our Korn Ferry DEI Maturity Model, shown to the right. This model measures the dimensions of diversity, equity, and inclusion within a culture across five dimensions—Risk Management, Awareness, Talent Integration, Operations Integration, and Market Integration. These dimensions are organized as wedges of a circumplex. Within each dimension, our DEI Maturity Model differentiates between behavioral and structural inclusion as an integrated and systemic means for assessing different elements of workplace inclusion:







This provides a framework that aligns with companies' overall business and talent strategies and helps to understand current state and the potential gaps with the desired aspirational state. In our DEI Compass survey, we provide detailed industry-specific benchmarks. In our peer/competitor research review we benchmark organizations against different industries and workforce composition. We map all findings against our DEI Maturity Model to assess current state, strengths, and opportunities to mature further.

4. Meeting with Boards of Trustees as part of the assessment and information-gathering process

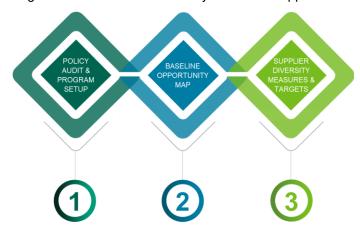

To form a corporation pursuant to the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware (the "General Corporation Law"), the undersigned hereby certifies as follows:

- 1. Name. The name of the corporation is "Personnel Decisions International Corporation."
- 2. Registered Office and Registered Agent. The address of the registered office of the corporation in Delaware is The Corporation Trust Company, Corporation Trust Center, 1209 Orange Street, Wilmington, DE 19801, County of New Castle, and the name of its registered agent at that address is The Corporation Trust Company.
- 3. <u>Purposes</u>. The purpose of the corporation is to engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the General Corporation Law.
- 4. <u>Capital Stock</u>. The total number of shares that the corporation is authorized to issue is three hundred thousand (300,000) shares of common stock, par value \$0.01 per share, consisting of two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) shares of voting common stock ("<u>Voting Stock</u>") and fifty thousand (50,000) shares of Class B non-voting common stock ("<u>Class B Stock</u>"). The Voting Stock and Class B Stock shall have the following characteristics, and in all other respects shall be identical:
 - (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided by statute, the holders of Voting Stock shall have the sole and exclusive right of voting on all corporate questions, including the election of the Board of Directors, to the exclusion of the holders of the Class B Stock, and the holders of the Class B Stock shall not be entitled to notice of meetings of stockholders.
 - (b) The Class B Stock shall automatically be converted into Voting Stock: (i) upon a vote of the holders of a majority of the Voting Stock then outstanding to extend all voting privileges held by the Voting Stock to the Class B Stock, or (ii) immediately prior the sale of Voting Stock in a "public offering" (to other than employees of the corporation) which requires registration under state or federal securities laws.

In the event of liquidation, dissolution, or winding up of the affairs of the corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, the total net assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations of the corporation shall be distributed equally to the holders of Voting Stock and Class B Stock without any preference whatsoever.

Stockholders of the corporation shall not have any preemptive rights to subscribe for, purchase or receive any part of any new or additional issue of stock of the corporation and no stockholder will be entitled to cumulate votes at any election of directors.

- 5. <u>Bylaws</u>. The board of directors of the corporation is expressly authorized to adopt, amend or repeal bylaws of the corporation except for bylaws with regard to the number of directors on the board and the terms of the directors.
- 6. <u>Limitation of Directors' Liability; Indemnification</u>. The personal liability of a director of the corporation to the corporation or its stockholders for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as a director shall be eliminated to the fullest extent permitted by law. The corporation is authorized to indemnify (and advance expenses to) its directors and officers to the fullest extent permitted by law. Neither the amendment, modification or repeal of this Article nor the adoption of any provision in this certificate of incorporation inconsistent with this Article shall adversely affect any right or protection of a director or officer of the corporation with respect to any act or omission that occurred prior to the time of such amendment, modification, repeal or adoption.
- 7. <u>Elections of Directors</u>. Elections of directors need not be by written ballot unless the bylaws of the corporation shall so provide.

AMENDED AND RESTATED CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF KORN FERRY (US)

- 1. The name of the Corporation is Korn Ferry (US) (the "Corporation").
- 2. The address of the Corporation's registered office in the State of Delaware is 251 Little Falls Drive, Wilmington, 19808, County of New Castle. The name of its registered agent at such address is Corporation Service Company.
- 3. The nature of the business of the Corporation and the objects or purposes to be transacted, promoted or carried on by it are as follows: To engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware (the "DGCL").
- 4. The total number of shares of all classes of stock that the Corporation is authorized to issue is one thousand (1,000) shares of Common Stock with a par value of \$0.0001 per share.
- 5. The Corporation, in accordance with Section 102(a) of the DGCL, hereby acknowledges that, as of the effectiveness of the filing of this Amended and Restated Certificate of Incorporation, its total assets, as defined in Section 503(i) of the DGCL, are not less than \$10,000,000.
- 6. The Board of Directors is expressly authorized to make, alter or repeal the Bylaws of the Corporation.
- 7. The stockholders are expressly authorized to make, alter or repeal the Bylaws of the Corporation.
- 8. Elections of directors need not be by written ballot unless the Bylaws of the Corporation shall so provide.
- 9. Whenever a compromise or arrangement is proposed between the Corporation and its creditors or any class of them and/or between the Corporation and its stockholders or any class of them, any court of equitable jurisdiction within the State of Delaware may, on the application in a summary way of the Corporation or of any creditor or stockholder thereof, or on the application of any receiver or receivers appointed for the Corporation under the provisions of Section 291 of the DGCL or on the application of trustees in dissolution or of any receiver or receivers appointed for the Corporation under the provisions of Section 279 of the DGCL order a meeting of the creditors or class of creditors, and/or of the stockholders or class of stockholders of the Corporation, as the case may be, to be summoned in such manner as the said court directs. If a majority in number representing three-fourths in value of the creditors or class of creditors, and/or of the stockholders or class of stockholders of the Corporation, as the case may be, agree to any compromise or

arrangement and to any reorganization of the Corporation as a consequence of such compromise or arrangement, the said compromise or arrangement and the said reorganization shall, if sanctioned by the court to which the said application has been made, be binding on all the creditors or class of creditors, and/or on all the stockholders or class of stockholders, of the Corporation, as the case may be, and also on the Corporation.

- 10. The Corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provision contained in this Certificate of Incorporation, in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by statute, and all rights conferred upon stockholders herein are granted subject to this reservation.
- 11. To the fullest extent permitted by Delaware statutory or decisional law, as amended or interpreted, no director of this Corporation shall be personally liable to the Corporation or its stockholders for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as a director. The corporation is authorized to indemnify (and advance expenses to) its directors and officers to the fullest extent permitted by law. No amendment to, or modification or repeal of, this Article 10 shall adversely affect any right or protection of a director of the Corporation existing hereunder with respect to any act or omission occurring prior to such amendment, modification or repeal. This Article 10 does not affect the availability of equitable remedies for breach of fiduciary duties.

DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CONTRACT PARTICIPATION

CalPERS Board of Administration requires contract participation from certified Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) in its contract process, unless specifically exempted. Only State of California, Office of Small Business and DVBE Services (OSDS) may certify a DVBE. - **C. Commercially Useful Function** A DVBE contractor, subcontractors, or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets all of the following criteria:
 - 1. The business concern is:
 - (a) Responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract;
 - (b) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved;
 - (c) Performs work that is normal for its business, services and function; and
 - 2. The business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work that is greater than would be expected by normal industry practices.

As an investor, similar to CalPERS DEI, a diverse approach also applies to fiduciary success. In a recent, June 11, 2025 RIC Report from Bank of America Global Research (Corrected), takeaways include a structural shift away from a "2% world" where there is a wider range of possible market outcomes, statics allocations to drifting markets is challenging, and May economic and market data presents a bullish outlook.

Vision and Action: Inclusion and Diversity best practices are about creating a more resilient, innovative, and client-centric organization. By embedding a culture of inclusion, establishing structural supports, and consistently measuring progress, the industry can harness diversity as a strategic asset. Another component for the success of DEI is providing the tools and resources as a bridge employee's personal and professional growth through education and experience. In the U.S. Army, there was a pathway toward unlimited potential through the application of education and roles. For example, in order to become a middle manager, one would need to have a civilian education and military education and successfully led 10+ employees for at least 2 years.

This comprehensive approach not only addresses the ethical imperatives but also creates tangible business value, ensuring that the investment industry can adapt and thrive in today's complex, dynamic environment.

12. Advising on DEI best practices for public sector organizations that are consistent with federal and state law, including Section 31 of Article I of the California Constitution (commonly known as "Proposition 209").

Below is an approach, "A Way", that blends legal compliance with practical DEI initiatives for public sector organizations—ensuring that all programs are both effective and aligned with federal law, state law, and Proposition 209:

- Legal Framework: We must build a foundation by mapping legal boundaries. Federal anti-discrimination laws and California's Proposition 209 (Section 31 of Article I of the California Constitution) require that public sector DEI efforts are race- and gender-neutral, meaning no preferential treatment is allowed. This means that while an organization can and will strive for an inclusive work environment, all practices

must be based on merit-based, objective, criteria such as skills, experience, and performance.

- Data-Driven Assessment: A comprehensive review of workforce demographics without targeting specific groups for preferential treatment. In an environment of big-data leveraging Machine Learning (ML) and Artificial Intelligence (AI), this becomes the expectation. CalPERS must collect and analyze quantitative and qualitative data on recruitment, talent acquisition, talent management, and retention processes. As part of this employee lifecycle, the onboarding and offboarding process is important. This helps CalPERS identify previously unknown barriers or gaps and ensures that subsequent interventions are fundamentally grounded in actual discrepancies in opportunity rather than assumptions.
- Transparent DEI Strategy: Formulate a DEI plan that addresses cultural inclusivity, professional development for all employees (not just managers), and equitable opportunity for all employees.

Key elements to consider

- Inclusive Recruitment: Design job descriptions and hiring processes that focus on competencies and skills and if possible, remove barriers such as college education.
- Unbiased Performance Metrics: Implement transparent criteria for evaluations, promotions, and professional development. Continuous Mentorship, effective communication, and regular feedback (performance counseling) are important.
- Accountability: Set clear, quantifiable objectives with regular reporting
 mechanisms that enable leadership to adjust practices as needed. It is
 important that clear, quantifiable objectives must be realistic and attainable
 otherwise accountability will be challenging.

- Invest in training programs: Education and experience focused on reducing unconscious bias and promoting cultural competence at all levels of the organization. This includes resourcing education and certification to promote employee personal and professional growth and retention in CalPERS.
- Engage External Expertise and Benchmarking: Consider collaborating with diversity experts, legal counsel, or external consultants who routinely work with government bodies.
- Continuous Improvement: Adopt a dynamic approach to developing and codifying systems of reviewing and updating DEI policies. In coordination with legal counsel, maintain a clear record of how decisions are made to defend against any claims of preferential treatment which reinforces CalPERS's commitment to both diversity and equal opportunity.

By balancing these levels of effort (LOE) with robust legal safeguards and ML/AI guardrails, CalPERS will effectively continue the growth of an inclusive workplace culture while remaining fully compliant with Proposition 209 and other statutory requirements. This approach not only enhances organizational effectiveness in a VUCA environment but also reinforces public trust by demonstrating a commitment to equitable practices for all employees and stakeholders.

13. Developing communication strategies highlighting the importance of DEI.

My approach to developing effective DEI communication strategies is both data-driven and collaborative. We must start with a foundation by grounding strategy in our organizational values and real experiences. It is important to gather comprehensive insight and employee candor through surveys, focus groups, and one-on-one conversations so that I truly understand where the gaps and opportunities lie. With that

CalPERS Board of Administration requires contract participation from certified Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) in its contract process, unless specifically exempted.  - 2. The management and control of the daily business operations are by one or more disabled veterans. The disabled veterans who exercise management and control are not required to be the same disabled veterans as the owners of the business concern.
 - 3. It is a sole proprietorship, corporation, or partnership with its home office located in the United States, which is not a branch or subsidiary of a foreign corporation, foreign firm, or other foreign based business.

- **C. Commercially Useful Function** A DVBE contractor, subcontractors, or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets all of the following criteria:
 - 1. The business concern is:
 - (a) Responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract;
 - (b) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved;
 - (c) Performs work that is normal for its business, services and function; and
 - 2. The business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work that is greater than would be expected by normal industry practices.

A contractor, subcontractor, or supplier will not be considered to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor's, subcontractor's, or supplier's role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of small business, microbusiness, or DVBE participation.
