Eric Schneider, MD, Harvard School of Public Health

Eric C. Schneider, M.D., M.Sc., is adjunct professor in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health where he has been on faculty since 1997. He is an internationally recognized expert on health policy, specializing in health care quality. Dr. Schneider is a primary care physician. Prior to 2015, Dr. Schneider was also faculty at Harvard Medical School where he practiced and taught primary care internal medicine at the Jen Center for Primary Care at Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Dr. Schneider has held several executive and national leadership roles. From 2022 to 2025 he was Executive Vice President at NCQA, a national health care quality standards organization. From 2015 to 2022 he was Senior Vice President for Policy and Research at the Commonwealth Fund. From 2009 to 2014, Dr. Schneider was a Senior Researcher at RAND, founding and leading the Boston Office. He held the RAND Distinguished Chair in Health Care Quality.

He is currently a member of the perspective advisory board of the New England Journal of Medicine. Past editorial roles include editor-in-chief of the International Journal for Quality in Health Care and service on the editorial boards of the National Quality Measures and Guidelines Clearinghouses sponsored by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality.

He is an elected fellow of the American College of Physicians, the National Academy of Social Insurance, and the New York Academy of Medicine. He was recipient (with co-authors) of the James S. Burgess Methods Article-of-the-Year-Award from the Journal of Health Services Research in 2023, the Health Services Research Impact Award from AcademyHealth in 2013, the Clinical Investigator Award from the Society for General Internal Medicine in 2001, and a Presidential Citation from the International Society for Quality in Health Care (ISQUA) in 2014.

Dr. Schneider serves as a trustee of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. Until 2026, he was a board member for AcademyHealth. Other notable leadership roles include co-chair of the Committee for Performance Measurement of the National Committee for Quality Assurance, member of the scientific advisory board of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement and founding chair of the Performance Measurement Committee of the American College of Physicians. He has served on expert advisory panels for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation (ASPE), the National Quality Forum (NQF), and the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).

Dr. Schneider holds a B.S., cum laude, in Biology from Columbia University, an M.Sc. from the University of California, Berkeley, and an M.D. from the University of California, San Francisco.
